# Foreword



OUTREACH Association of Volunteers for Rural Development started its journey for rural development on 25.05.1993 with the vision of empowering the vulnerable community in the semi-arid areas of Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu. It has completed 25 years of serving the people in the remote areas. OUTREACH organized silver jubilee celebration and conducted a seminar on 'Rural Development- Multi Dimensional Perspective' on 25.05.2018, which was inaugurated by Shri. N. Santosh Hegde, former Judge Supreme Court of India and Lokayukta Government of Karnataka. This provided an occasion for OUTREACH partners, government departments, to share their experiences with regard to rural development. Dr. S.C.V. Reddy, member of OUTREACH Executive Committee, took special interest in this programme and brought out a souvenir on this occasion.

It is heartening to state that an organization founded by Late James Mascarenhas (Jimmy), 25 years back with the vision of empowering the vulnerable community has worked and influenced positively the lives of about 1.5 lakh families living in about 2700 villages spread over 16 districts of Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Telangana and Chattisgarh.

OUTREACH got programmes initially from external donors to carry out its activities. But later on, we looked up for new opportunities and projects with government departments, corporate and individual partners to carry out rural development programmes. Now the organization takes up multi-dimensional activities in the area of organizing community; natural resources management; social forestry and environment; education, healthcare and nutrition; skill development, livelihood improvement; water sanitation and hygiene; climate change adaptation and mitigation; research, training, evaluation study and capacity building.

During the year the programmes undertaken are :

NABARD supported formation, nurturing, promotion of eight Farmer Producer Organizations (FPO's) in Bidar and Belgavi / Bagalkot districts; climate proofing of completed watershed development project (KFW) in Ramdurga taluk of Belgavi district; soil health project - sustainable development plan in completed watersheds in Aurad taluk of Bidar district.

NABARD also supported the formation, nurturing, promotion of Farmer Producer Organizations (FPO) in Bhadradi Kothagudem district, climate proofing project (CPP) in Bendalapadu watershed development project, Bhadradi Kothagudem district, Telangana.

ITC Ltd supported soil and moisture conservation (SMC), improved agricultural practices (IAP), community development programmes (CDP) & social forestry programmes in Hassan & Mysuru districts, integrated watershed development & tank rehabilitation programme in Nellore district.

Detailed Project planning and supervision of works pertaining to rejuvenation of Shanumangala lake at Bidadi supported by BOSCH was carried out by us.

Rajiv Gandhi Chaithanya Yojane in Chickballpur, Ballari and Bagalkote districts came to an end during the year.

I thank the governing body and executive committee members for their support. I also thank OUTREACH team who have extended their support during the implementation of the programmes.

## About OUTREACH

OUTREACH is a non-profit organization registered under Karnataka Societies Act 1960 and working in south India since 1993. It has touched the lives of about 1.5 lakhs marginalized and vulnerable families for their sustainable livelihood and development. While implementing programmes OUTREACH has kept its principle of bottom-up approach and participatory methodologies i.e. listening to the community, understanding the problems with the community, getting consensus, developing strategy, checking ideas against experience and progress, constant review and reaffirmation. OUTREACH facilitates the people to organize themselves into viable groups/institutions and empower them to place legitimate demand on the system to address their developmental needs for sustainable livelihood.

### Working with the people

OUTREACH approach is to organize the people into viable groups/institutions and form community based organizations (CBOs) and thus empower them to take up livelihood and developmental projects. OUTREACH organizes capacity building programmes for the stakeholders engaged with community based participatory project planning, implementation and management of developmental programmes. PRA and other participatory techniques are commonly used by OUTREACH in areas of natural resources management (NRM), livelihood programmes and watershed management.

The CBOs formed by OUTREACH depends on the requirements of the projects and peoples' need. OUTREACH had been involved in various types of CBOs. The details are furnished in the table;

## OUTREACH PROGRAMMES and CENTRES

OUTREACH is operationally active in the states of Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Chhattisgarh and Tamil Nadu. It has centres at Bagalkot, Ballari, Bidar, Guribidanur and Belagavi in Karnataka. In Andhra Pradesh, OUTREACH resource centre is located at Madanapalli, Chittoor district. In Telangana the project centre is located at Bhadradi Kothgudem district and in Tamil Nadu centre is located at Hosur, Krishnagiri district. These resource centres are used for, running capacity building programmes, taking up activities around the centre related to watershed development, natural resource management and livelihood support. The onsite program focuses on the education and health care of young children of migrant construction workers in Bengaluru. In addition, we have started our programmes in the areas suggested by government and donor agencies. They are Atmakuru, Vinjamuru, Duttaluru and Kaligiri Mandals of Nellore District Andhra Pradesh, Arkalgud of Hassan district, Hunsur of Mysuru district, in Karnataka. # 1. Climate Proofing of Completed Watershed Development Project

NABARD has sanctioned the climate change adaption (CCA) project to OUTREACH in the year 2017. This programme is running with a concept of protecting & increasing soil health and water conservation. The programme is operative in Arebenchi and Kamakeri watershed of Ramdurga taluk of Belgavi district.

## Objectives :

- i. Improving adaptation to climate variability/change in farm sector with better management and maintenance of soil and water regime enabling better crop/pasture land productivity and thus resulting increase in income of small and marginal farmers.
- ii. Promoting climate resilient farming system and diversification of livelihoods engaging community.
- iii. Reducing climate change vulnerability and process of marginalization with integration of risk mitigation products, like crop, weather and market advisory; and information system.

Under this programme, awareness and training on climate change and its adaption technics to the farmers, capacity building training to the SHGs members, exposure visit to progressive farmers & committee members to manage their high yield in less rain fall condition, poultry units to non-farming members to increase their income & life style are provided. Other activities like; field bund, stone outlet, vermi compost, NADEP compost, alternative crop, inter crop, tank silt application etc. are carried out to increase soil health and water conversation.

## Works undertaken

- **Soil and water conservation (S&WC):** Existing watersheds are rehabilitated and stabilised through redesigned and additional climate resilient, soil and water conservation measures.  
Redesigning of S&WC structures, vegetation cover enhancement, field bund, stone outlet, borewell recharge pit, bund plantation, energy plantation, horticulture plantation.
- **Soil health improvement and productivity enhancement:** Soil health is improved and productivity is enhanced, which leads to secured and increased potential for production and productivity of animal husbandry and agriculture.  
Soil testing and introduction of soil health cards, management of soil structure, nutrient management: Overall soil health (carbon content, availability of micro-and macro-nutrients) is improved by application of organic manures, farm yard manure, green leaf, tank silt, vermin compost, etc  
Soil testing and issuing soil health card, deep ploughing, summer ploughing, green manure, NADEP method compost, vermi compost, azolla demo unit, green fodder cultivation
- **Sustainable NRM livelihood practices for food security:** Climate change (CC) resilient cropping systems are adopted.  
Crop diversification & intensification, inter cropping and crop rotation, introduction of new CC resilient varieties, sustainable NRM practices, introduction of diversified sources of food-kitchen garden, backyard poultry etc  
Alteranative crop, intercropping, alteranative varieties of demo, cattleshed improvement, cycle

weeder, pump sprayer, improved cook stove, weather based agro advisory service, solar lamp, kitchen garden, poultry unit

- **CC risk management practices:** Introduction of resource centres/ agri-clinics, seed farms, common equipment and agri-input centres, village knowledge centres, fodder banks

Village knowledge resource center, awareness & mobilization

- **Accompanying measures:** Best practices of watershed level institutional strengthening, capacity building, knowledge management are developed integrated into participatory watershed development approaches for soil management as CCA tool.

Climate proofing project (CPP) in Bendalapadu watershed Bhadradri Kothagudem district has been sanctioned in March for a period of five year i.e. 2019 to 2022. The activities have started in the area.

## 2. Farmer Producer Organizations (FPO)

NABARD sanctioned formation of twelve farmers' producer organizations with three years plan and sanctioned Rs. 9.06 lakhs for each FPO. Farmer producer organizations are registered under Companies Act. Awareness meetings were conducted at village level and OUTREACH team collected farmers' shares amount of Rs. 500 each.

The OUTREACH team has focused on social mobilization, awareness creation and motivating the farmers after conducting a baseline survey.

This programme is operative in Belagavi, Bagalkot & Bidar districts in Karnataka and Bhadradri Kothagudem District of Telangana. Twelve FPOs have been formed in these districts with the support of NABARD.

### 3. Sustainable Development Project (SDP)

- a.) Sustainable Development Project (SDP) was started from April 2017 in the area where already NABARD watershed development project was undertaken in the past. The Chintakinala watershed development programme was completed in December 2012. The main purpose of SDP was to support the different stakeholders in the watershed area by building their capacity for different purposes.

#### Capacity building and training programmes

- i. **Training kitchen garden :** Training was organized on kitchen garden to women from different SHGs members on 04.07.2018 and 32 members attended the programme.
- ii. **Poultry training:** This was organized on rearing of backyard poultry for women from different SHGs on 09.07.2018 and 28 members attended.
- iii. **Training on livestock, dairy and fodder management:** Twenty Chinthaki farmers and SHGs members attended this training programme on 26.07.2018 .
- iv. **Digital economic practice:** One day training programme on digitization of financial transaction was conducted in Naganapalli on 02.11.2018 and 50 members attended.
- v. **Crop and livestock training:** One day training programme on crop and livestock was organized for Beldal village farmers on 5.11.2018 for 50 members.
- vi. **Value addition training programme:** One day training programme on value addition and market linkage was organized for Chintaki and Beldal farmers on 10.08.2019 for 25 members.
- vii. **Training on local institution:-** One day training was organized on local institution for Chinthaki SHGs, farmers club and FPO members on 17.11.2018

viii. **Improve soil fertility by different methods:** This training on use of bio fertilizers and improved seed and sowing techniques was organized on 20.11.2018 for 25 Chinthaki farmers.

ix. **Training to local institution members about management of institution:** This training was conducted at the community hall in Chinthaki village for a day.

b) NABARD has come out with Sustainable Development Programme (SDP), in Bendalpadu watershed area located in Chandragonda mandal of Bhadravari, Kothgudam district with the objectives of the programme:

- To create awareness to the farmers on their soils and suitable crops.
- To strengthen village institutions and watershed institutions.
- To promote sustainable agricultural practices.
- To improve farmer's income with allied agriculture sectors and livelihoods.

- **Activities carried out are :** kitchen garden (12 Plots-4 x 10 feet size), promotion of organic farming, better cotton initiatives-105 acres, application of micro nutrients(195 acres), soil sample testing (200 samples), soil mapping for micro & macro nutrients, establishment of seed bank, agro-advisory services (sim charges for 200 farmers).

- **Trainings on topics :** Crop water budgeting & crop planning (watershed-wise two seasons), soil sample collection & labelling (300 farmers), nutrient deficiency management in soil (300 farmers), organic farming, convergence with line departments, corporates, KVK, bankers, fodder station, ploughing and inter-cropping.
- **Exposure Visits :** Within state - 100 farmers - 01 day and outside state - 50 farmers - 02 days

## 4. Integrated watershed development & tank rehabilitation programme

Integrated watershed development and tank management was implemented in 9 western Mandals i.e., Marrisipadu, Varikuntapadu, Kaluvayi, Chejarla, Ananthasagaram, Duttalur, Vinjamur, Kaligiri and Atmakur of Nellore district Andhra Pradesh. Outreach team had conducted baseline survey and had collected all the information required for the project activities.

The project operational area is about 140 km. from the district head quarters, and is one of the drought prone areas in the district. 60% of the households are from backward families depending on seasonal rainfed agriculture. The remaining 40% are agriculture labourers who depend on seasonal agriculture and migrate to nearby towns during off season. During the year, 16 villages were covered.

- During the year, the project has taken up, area treatment (TCBs and RFDs) farm ponds, renovation of tanks and desiltation. 94,485 cmt of water storage capacity is created. This resulted in retention of soil and moisture conservation and recharge of ground water.





### Renovation, Repair and Reclamation (RRR) of tanks and water bodies

In seven villages and seven tanks, RRR was taken up; most of the activities were on jungle clearance, bund strengthening, and revetment, desilt and silt application. 151 beneficiaries directly applied the silt in 461 ha lands.

## 5. Soil Moisture Conservation, Improved Agriculture Practices & Social Forestry Programme

This programme started in the month of February 2013 in Arkalgud of Hassan district and later in April 2014 at Hunsuru taluk of Mysuru district with the objectives of improving rural economy which is mainly agriculture based. Protection of natural resources with the revival of traditional tank systems, establishing local management through building village tank monitoring and management committee and network them across the tank cascade were main activities. The project has also focused on small and marginal landholders, agriculturists, well owners, women and the landless people through training in the management of water structures in the area. The project has organized the farmers making them participate in the conservation and development works.

### Activities

The activities carried out are; entry point activity, capacity building of farmers, tank rehabilitation, social forestry, trench cum bunds, agro business centers and bio- diversity park.

During the year 2018-19, 89 village level meetings were conducted at Hunsur. In the meeting they discussed about forestry, sanitation, agro business centre (ABC) strengthening and identification of volunteer for motivating the social forestry plantation.

### Soil test

Soil health condition was tested by collecting soil samples from individual farm land as well as tank. 138 soil samples have been tested in Hunsur. These reports have been given to the respective farmers. This helped them to grow different crops based on the soil health condition.

### Net Planning

Net planning was made in below mentioned watershed area of Hunsur taluk. Kallahalli, Bannikuppe, Hemmige, Aththikuppe, Kallikoppalu, Kaamgowdanahalli, Kanagalu, Udduru, Voddambalu, Biligere, Habbanakuppe and Gavadagere of Harave watershed area. Hosakote and Angatahally of Hosakote watershed areas. The net planning made for 850 hectares. This would be very useful to take up land treatment in the recommended area in the future.

## Training

During the year 2018-19, 15 capacity building trainings of one day each, were conducted for the members of 15 ABCs for initiating social forestry programme. Capacity building was provided to the tank user groups (TUG) farmers on institutional management and their roles and responsibilities, structure, characteristics and guidelines to the committee members. The purpose of the training is to enhance people's participation in village development by forming ABC/TUG and committee members were trained to know the legal structure for their institution sustainability.

## Trench cum bunding

A bund is like an embankment, often built around the periphery of farmland and across the slope to prevent water run-off. Bunds and trenches help reduce soil erosion and retain water during scanty rainfall. They also improve ground water level by increasing in filtration.

OUTREACH guides farmers to build bunds and trenches on scientific lines as part of its soil and water conservation efforts. Farmers are advised to grow grass on their bunds in order to reduce the intensity of rain falling directly on them.

1200 ha of farm lands treated and 86,649 cmt - silt was removed in Hunsur taluk during the year.

## Agro forestry

- Individual farmers are being encouraged to plant trees on their own farm land to meet the domestic needs of the family shade for the agriculture crops, and reduce wind erosion , soil conservation.
- Total 1131 formers were covered in 150 villages and 724,130 Silver clones 30,250 Cassurina and 50,320 Melia Dubia clone were planted totaling 176950 number of plants.

## 6. Community Development Programme

The community development project was launched in August 2016. The project was broadly designed to support health related to personal hygiene and providing financial support for individual household toilet construction. Ground work started by contacting the beneficiaries, collecting the gap list (families who do not have toilet) from gram panchayath. Informal meetings were conducted to work out strategy for implementation of the programme.

### Project area

With the support of ITC and with the collaboration of government department the construction of individual household toilet was started in Hunsur taluk of Mysuru district. The team has covered nine core villages in Hunsur taluk and visited the core village schools, eight-gram panchayath and individual household beneficiaries and arranged meeting with the beneficiaries and discussed regarding the sanitation facilities, monitoring and maintenance. As per their opinion, the team planned renovation construction of old toilets. To motivate the stake holders different training programme were conducted.

### Baseline survey

Baseline survey was done by local volunteers and submitted to project office for consolidation. 1371 families which did not have toilet in their houses were identified from 14 villages.

## Meetings

49 meetings were conducted with the beneficiaries during the year. 1610 members (513 women & 1097 men ) participated in these meetings. The issues discussed in these meetings were; OUTREACH aims and objectives, improvement in the general quality of life in the rural areas, awareness programmes and experience sharing was conducted for promoting cleanliness, hygiene and eliminating open defecation, encourage cost effective and appropriate technologies for ecologically safe and sustainable sanitation, the risks of consuming unsafe water and scientific hygiene practices.

Totally 506 (244 boys, 262 girls) students and 41 teachers participated in this programme. 24 street plays were conducted in 24 villages to create awareness among the community on the advantages and necessity of using the toilet.

## 7. Skills to Succeed - Retail Customer Interaction Programme

My Quest skills to succeed programmes was launched to enable rural youth for self-learning through the digital curriculum which was designed and supported by Quest Alliance.

This programme was useful and was beneficial for rural unemployed youths. They came out of fear, shyness, gained confidence to work and learnt communication skill in Hagaribommanahalli, Ballari district. Content of the programme were, communicative English, my career, retail, customer interaction, computer basic and tally 9.0.

### Programme target and accomplishments

This programme had a target of training 450 candidates for the period 2015-16 to 2017-18 and to provide placement for minimum of 70% candidates. 396 candidates were trained during these years and about 60% had been placed in various sectors like schools, printing press, photo studio, vehicle showrooms, retail stores, BSL India Pvt Ltd, data entry operator, courier services etc. The programme closed during first quarter of the year 2018-19.

## 8. Rejuvenation of lake

Rejuvenation of Shanumangala lake began with a community meeting with BOSCH and OUTREACH team. During the meeting, the community was given a detailed explanation about the scope of work. It was decided to take the NOC from the panchayath for taking up work. OUTREACH was selected as the technical consultant for this project.

A topo – survey was conducted for the total area to ascertain the existing features of the lake and surrounding area. The total area of the lake was 20 heactares. DPR (Detailed Project Report) was prepared incorporating all the aspects of rejuvenation. The latest CAG report on lake rejuvenation by the government was used as reference to avoid the mistakes and the recommendations wer incorporated wherever it was possible.

This was shared and debated with BOSCH, and was eventually accepted.

Periodical consultative meetings were held with the BOSCH PO, Technical and Finance teams. A community meeting was held along with panchayath members, BOSCH Foundation and the team from OUTREACH.

During the meeting and site visits, the DPR was explained to all in detail.

MJS was selected as vender for the implementation of phase -1 of project by BOSCH.

The work progressed according to the season and site condition. All the proposed activity was completed with extended duration. The maintenance of plants and other assets created are continued.

During the course, weekly meetings were held involving senior members of BOSCH, BOSCH Foundation, venders, OUTREACH and the community.

Tahsildar, KIADB, Revenue department and panchayath members were involved to resolve local conflicts which helped in taking immediate decision to expedite the work. The entire process was transparent. The negative perception of the community at the beginning gradually changed as the work progressed. They are now convinced about the importance of lake rejuvenation.

It was a different nature of partnership where an NGO, corporate, foundation, venders, community, panchayath, govt depts were involved.

In this rejuvenation process, nearly 100 different species (local, forestry, ornamental, flowering, bamboo species) were planted in the catchment area and buffer zone.

OUTREACH has submitted DPR for further development of the lake.



## 9. Education, Health and Nutrition Programme

The education programme for the children of migrant construction workers is based in Bengaluru since 1993, which caters to the education, nutritional and health care of children. They come from remote villages of Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, and Tamil Nadu and from states in North India, to earn a living on construction sites in Bengaluru. As the workers move from one site to another, their children are deprived of schooling. The day care centre facilities provided at the construction sites and children are taught non-formal education through child friendly/joyful teaching methods.

### The objectives of the day care centre

- Provide pre-school and non-formal education for the children.
- Provide quality health care by conducting regular health camps, special health camps and awareness camps.
- To raise awareness among the builders' community, NGOs, government agencies and general public about the plight of this community.

In May 2013, livelihood support activities were initiated at OUTREAH-Hosur project with initial investment of Rs.17,05,000/- and further disbursement was made during Feb 2018 to an extent of Rs.14,95,000/- on the demand of active SHG members and the total amount of Rs.75,50,000/- has been disbursed as livelihood promotional fund including plough back amount till 31.03.2019. During the period Rs.14,95,000/- has been disbursed to 3 SHGs of 2 villages. This disbursement has benefited 27 members for 9 livelihood activities and the principal repayment is 100%. Apart from the above Rs. 5,00,000/- has been disbursed to OUTREACH Bidar project (Short term funding ) during June 2018 for Sarvagna Farmer Producers Organisation- Chintaki for agricultural inputs procurement.

### **Report on the financial statements**

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Outreach Association of Volunteers for Rural Development, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019, Income and expenditure statement and the Receipts and payments for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

### **Governing body's responsibility for the financial Statements**





ಹಾಗೆಯೇ ಅವರವರ ಕೌಟುಂಬಿಕ ಸ್ಥಿತಿಗತಿಗಳಿಗೆ ಅನುಗುಣವಾಗಿ ವಿವಿಧ ರೀತಿಯ ಸ್ವ ಉದ್ಯೋಗ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗಳ ಆಯ್ಕೆಯ ಬಗ್ಗೆ ಪರಿಚಯಿಸಲಾಯಿತು. ಇದರಂತೆ ತಮ್ಮ ಕೌಟುಂಬಿಕ ಸ್ಥಿತಿಗತಿಗಳಿಗೆ ಅನುಗುಣವಾಗಿ ಹೈನುಗಾರಿಕೆ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಯನ್ನು ಅಯ್ದುಕೊಳ್ಳಲಾಗಿ ಅರ್ಜಿ ಮತ್ತು ಯೋಜನಾ ವರದಿಯನ್ನು ತಯಾರಿಸಿ ಔಟ್‌ರೀಚ್ ಗ್ರಾಮೀಣ ಅಭಿವೃದ್ಧಿ ಸ್ವಯಂ ಸೇವಾ ಸಂಸ್ಥೆ ಮೂಲಕ ತಾಲ್ಲೂಕು ಪಂಚಾಯತಿಯ ಕಾರ್ಯ ನಿರ್ವಹಣಾಧಿಕಾರಿಗಳ ಅನುಮೋದನೆಯೊಂದಿಗೆ ತಮ್ಮ ಸೇವಾ ವ್ಯಾಪ್ತಿಯ ಕಾರ್ಪೋರೇಷನ್ ಬ್ಯಾಂಕ್‌ಗೆ ಸಲ್ಲಿಸಲಾಯಿತು. ನಂತರ ಕಾರ್ಪೋರೇಷನ್ ಬ್ಯಾಂಕ್‌ನ ವ್ಯವಸ್ಥಾಪಕರು/ ಕ್ಷೇತ್ರಾಧಿಕಾರಿಗಳು ಮತ್ತು ಯೋಜನಾ ಬೆಂಬಲ ಸಂಸ್ಥೆಯ ಸಿಬ್ಬಂದಿಗಳು ಗ್ರಾಮಕ್ಕೆ ಭೇಟಿ ನೀಡಿ ಕುಟುಂಬದ ವಿವರ ಮತ್ತು ಹೈನುಗಾರಿಕೆ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗೆ ಸಂಬಂಧಿಸಿದಂತೆ ಸ್ಥಳ ಪರಿಶೀಲನೆ ನಡೆಸಲಾಗಿ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗೆ ಸಂಬಂಧಿಸಿದಂತೆ ಸಾಲ ಮಂಜೂರಾತಿ ಪತ್ರವನ್ನು ಯೋಜನಾ ಬೆಂಬಲ ಸಂಸ್ಥೆಗೆ ನೀಡಲಾಯಿತು. ಯೋಜನಾ ಬೆಂಬಲ ಸಂಸ್ಥೆಯ ಮಾರ್ಗದರ್ಶನದ ಮೇರೆಗೆ ಕೆನರಾ ಬ್ಯಾಂಕ್ ಸ್ವ ಉದ್ಯೋಗ ತರಬೇತಿ ಕೇಂದ್ರ, ಚಿಕ್ಕಬಳ್ಳಾಪುರ ಇಲ್ಲಿ ತರಬೇತಿ ಪಡೆಯಲಾಯಿತು.


ಯೋಜನಾ ಬೆಂಬಲ ಸಂಸ್ಥೆಯು ಜಿಲ್ಲಾ ಪಂಚಾಯತಿಯಿಂದ 10,000/- ರೂ ಸಹಾಯಧನವನ್ನು ಬ್ಯಾಂಕ್‌ಗೆ ತಲುಪಿಸಿತು. ಕಾರ್ಪೋರೇಷನ್ ಬ್ಯಾಂಕಿನ ಮಾರ್ಗದರ್ಶನದಂತೆ ಮಿಶ್ರತಳಿ ಹಸುವನ್ನು ಪಕ್ಕದ ಸೋಮೇನಹಳ್ಳಿ ಗ್ರಾಮದಲ್ಲಿ 50,000/-ರೂಗಳಿಗೆ ವ್ಯಾಪಾರವನ್ನು ಮಾಡಲಾಯಿತು. ಪಶು ವೈದ್ಯಾಧಿಕಾರಿಗಳಿಂದ ಪರಿಶೀಲನೆ ಮಾಡಿಸಿ ಪ್ರಮಾಣಪತ್ರ ಮತ್ತು ಪಶು ಆರೋಗ್ಯ ವಿಮೆಯನ್ನು ಪಡೆಯಲಾಯಿತು. ಇದರ ಆಧಾರದ ಮೇರೆಗೆ ಬ್ಯಾಂಕಿನ ವ್ಯವಸ್ಥಾಪಕರು 50,000/-ರೂ ಸಾಲವನ್ನು ಬಡುಗಡೆ ಮಾಡಲಾದ ಬಳಿಕ ಮಿಶ್ರತಳಿ ಹಸುವನ್ನು ಖರೀದಿಮಾಡಲಾಯಿತು. ಪ್ರತಿ ದಿನವು ಸುಮಾರು 10ರಿಂದ 12 ಲೀಟರ್ ಹಾಲನ್ನು ಸ್ಥಳೀಯ ಹಾಲಿನ ಡೈರಿಗೆ ಹಾಕಲಾಗುತ್ತಿದೆ. ಪ್ರತಿ ಲೀಟರ್‌ಗೆ 25/- ರೂಗಳಂತೆ ದಿನಕ್ಕೆ 300/-ರೂ ಗಳಿಸಿ, ತಿಂಗಳಿಗೆ 9000/-ರೂಗಳನ್ನು ದುಡಿಯಲಾಗುತ್ತಿದೆ. ಇದರಲ್ಲಿ ತಿಂಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಹಸುವಿನ ಖರ್ಚು 2000/- ಮತ್ತು ಸಾಲದ ಕಂತಿಗೆ 1200/- ರೂ ಗಳನ್ನು ಖರ್ಚು ಮಾಡಿ ಉಳಿದ ಹಣವನ್ನು ಉಳಿತಾಯ ದೊಂದಿಗೆ ಕುಟುಂಬದ ನಿರ್ವಹಣೆಗಾಗಿ ಬಳಸಿಕೊಳ್ಳಲಾಗುತ್ತಿದೆ.

ಈ ಹಿಂದೆ ಮಳೆಯಾಶ್ರಿತ ಋಷಿ ಜಮೀನಿನಲ್ಲಿ ಬೆಳೆಯನ್ನೇ ನಂಜುಕೊಂಡು, ದಿನಕೂಲಿ ಮಾಡಿ ಕುಟುಂಬದ ನಿರ್ವಹಣೆ, ಮಕ್ಕಳ ವಿದ್ಯಾಭ್ಯಾಸ ಮತ್ತು ಆರೋಗ್ಯಕ್ಕಾಗಿ ಸ್ಥಳೀಯ ಅಧಿಕ ಬಡ್ಡಿದಾರರ ಸಾಲಗಳಿಗೆ ಸಿಲುಕಿ ಸಾಲಗಾರರಾಗಿ ಕಷ್ಟಗಳನ್ನು ಅನುಭವಿಸಬೇಕಾಗಿತ್ತು. ಇಂತಹ ಪರಿಸ್ಥಿತಿಯಲ್ಲಿ ರಾಜೀವ್‌ಗಾಂಧಿ ಜೈತನ್ಯ ಯೋಜನೆಯ ಸಾಲ ಮತ್ತು ಸಹಾಯಧನದ ಸೌಲಭ್ಯವನ್ನು ಪಡೆದು ನೆಮ್ಮದಿಯ ಬದುಕನ್ನು ಸಾಗಿಸುವ ಅವಕಾಶ ಪಡೆಯಲಾಗಿರುತ್ತದೆ. ತಮ್ಮ ಕುಟುಂಬದಲ್ಲಿ ಕೃಷಿ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆ ಜೊತೆಗೆ ಹೈನುಗಾರಿಕೆಯನ್ನು ಲಾಭದಾಯಕವಾದ ಸ್ವ ಉದ್ಯೋಗವನ್ನಾಗಿ ಕೈಗೊಳ್ಳಲಾಗಿದೆಯಲ್ಲದೆ, ದಿನಕೂಲಿಗಾಗಿ ಪರದಾಡುವ ಸ್ಥಿತಿ ಕಡಿಮೆಯಾಗಿ, ತಾವು ಕೈಗೊಂಡಿರುವ ಹೈನುಗಾರಿಕೆ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಯಿಂದ ಪರಾವಲಂಬಿಯಾಗದೆ ಸ್ವಾವಲಂಬಿಯಾಗಿ ದುಡಿದು ನಮ್ಮ ಕುಟುಂಬದ ನಿರ್ವಹಣೆಯನ್ನು ನೆಮ್ಮದಿಯಿಂದ ಸಾಗಿಸುವ ವ್ಯವಸ್ಥೆ ಒದಗಿ ಬಂದಿದೆ.
